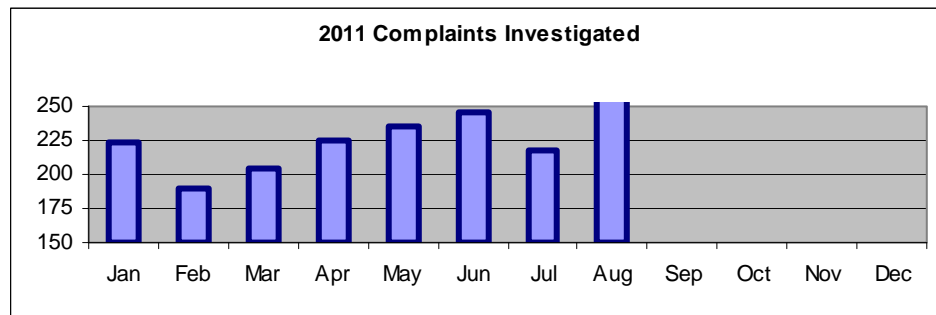
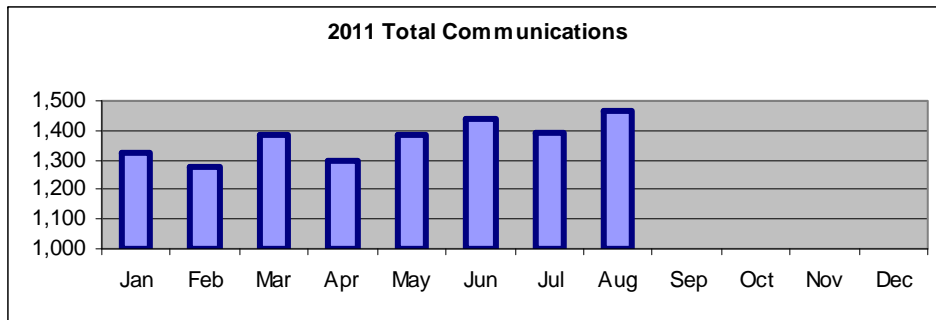



12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH

- The department hosted its 15th annual National Night Out Celebration on Tuesday, August 2, 2011. As in past years, the event was well attended by members of the community. Our coordinator, Janice Froshour, put another outstanding evening together in what has become a nationally recognized award winner.
- Members of the department delivered over 700 pounds of food items to two local food pantries. The food collection program is an outgrowth of the National Night Out event that has recruited the local business community to serve as food collection sites.
- During the weekend of August 24th and 25th, the police department worked through the effects of Hurricane Irene which had struck the Eastern Seaboard. The Township Emergency Management Team activated an operations center in the police building throughout the storm. The township fared very well, experiencing a few electrical outages and fallen trees. Several main roads in the township were closed at various times due to flooding. The township Highway Department did an outstanding job in providing barricades and other necessities for the roadways.
