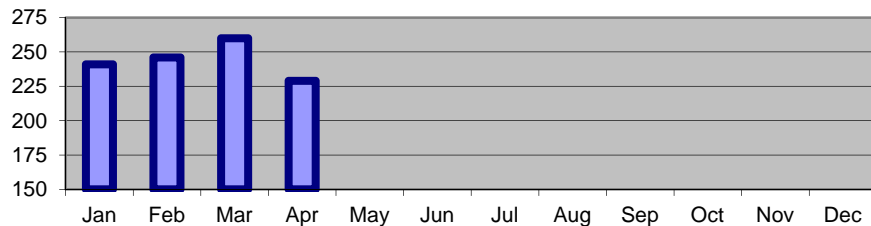

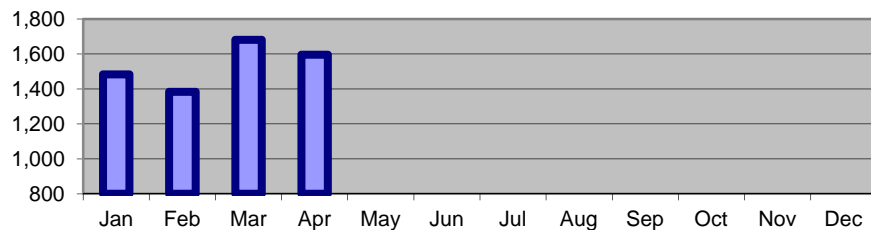

## 12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH

- Officer Glenn Kranich attended a two-week investigators class that was presented by the Montgomery County Detective's Bureau. He and other students experienced "hands-on" training of various forensic and investigative processes.
- Randy Graber was hired to fill a vacancy in the part-time officer ranks. He has served previously as an officer with the Boyertown Police Department.
- Officers from the department responded to a bomb threat at the Souderton Area High School on Monday, April 14th. A search of the building was completed by bomb-sniffing police dogs. No devices were found and the building was declared to be safe.
- On Wednesday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>, Chief Kozeniewski and Sergeant Rinker participated in the biennial Criminal Justice Career Day program at the Montgomery County Community College.
- Also on the 23<sup>rd</sup>, Sgt. Steve Rinker hosted a class on criminal investigations and forensic evidence gathering for district residents. The class was presented in conjunction with the Souderton Area School District Adult Education Program.
