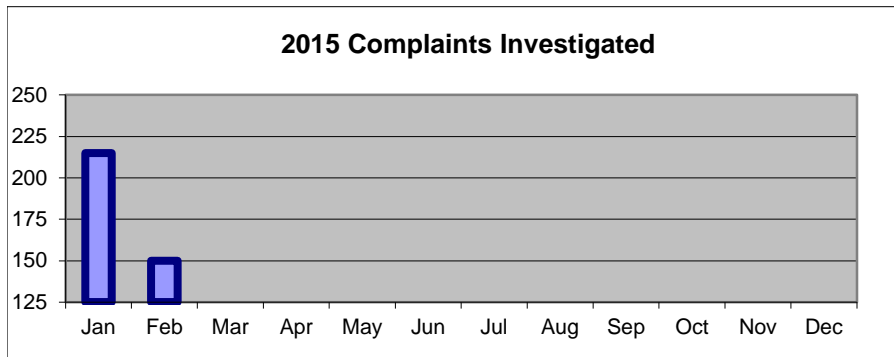
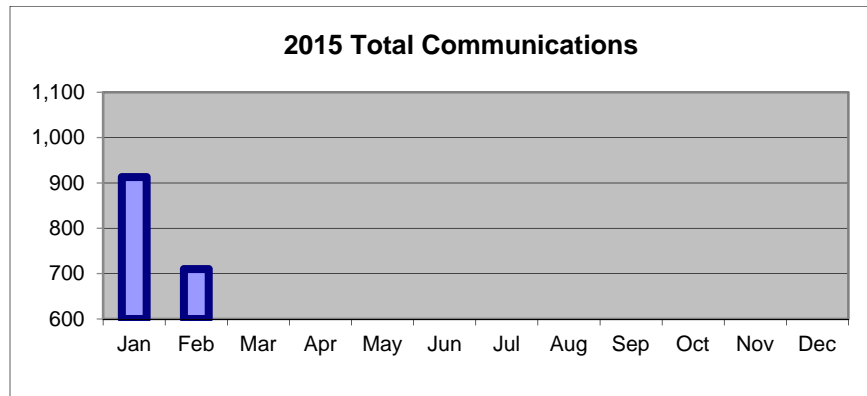


12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH

- On February 18th, our officers responded to a stabbing incident at the JBS Rendering Plant on Souder Road. Two employees had become involved in a scuffle that resulted in the death of one of the participants when he was stabbed repeatedly with a knife. The actor then attempted to commit suicide by stabbing himself. He survived but was charged with Murder while recovering in the hospital.

Our neighboring departments provided immediate assistance upon the initial call. We are very appreciative of their support as well as those members of the Montgomery County Detectives Office who worked with our officers in obtaining witness interviews, the collection of evidence, and the processing of the crime scene.

This was the first homicide in the township since 1985.
