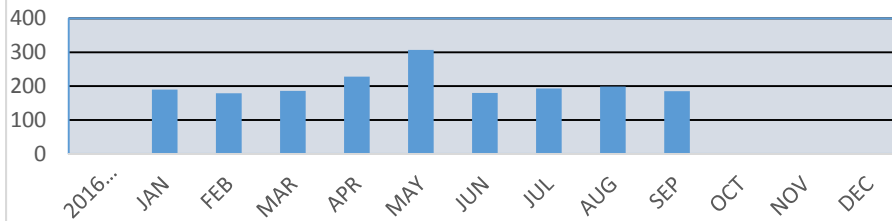

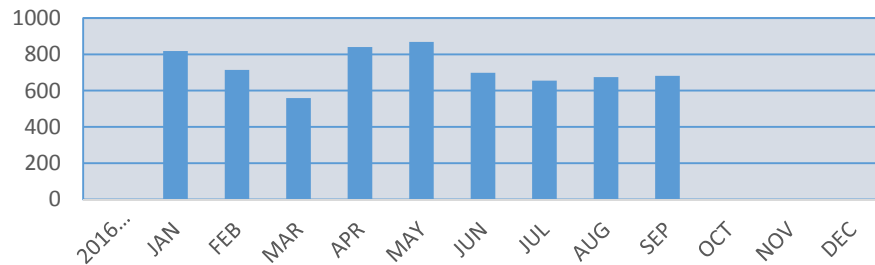


12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH

- On September 13th, our officers responded to a home on Bartlett Court after receiving a report that a despondent man was threatening to harm himself. Initial reports indicated that the man had numerous weapons in the house.

After unsuccessful attempts to contact the man were made, the team of officers from the Montgomery County SWAT - Central Region were dispatched to the scene. After seven hours of speaking with the man via phone, he came out of the house and surrendered to officers. He was then transported to a facility to determine his mental health.

Fortunately, no injuries were sustained by any of the officers, the suspect, or residents.
