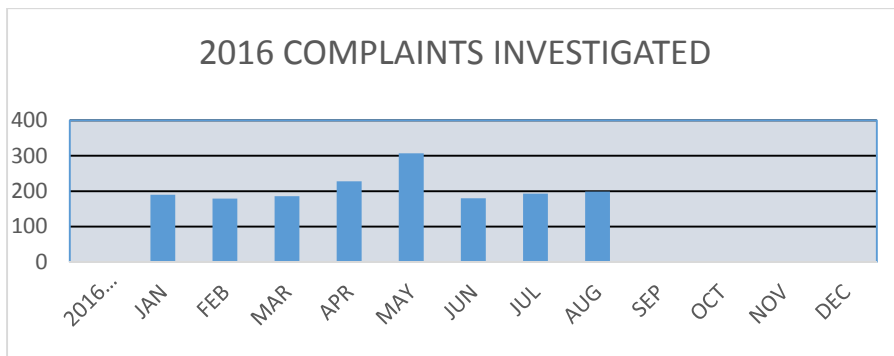
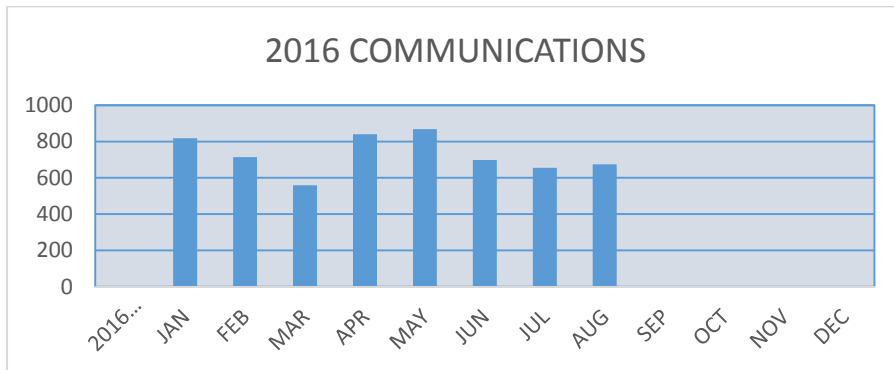

## 12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH

- On August 11<sup>th</sup>, Chief Kozeniewski and the other police chiefs from the Indian Valley held their annual meeting with Souderton Area High School Principal, Dr. Sam Varano, and his staff to discuss the upcoming school year.
- On the same day, Officer Glenn Kranich was the guest lecturer at the high school's student driver class.
- The 2006 Ford Expedition patrol vehicle was decommissioned and sold to the high school security staff for their use.
- Detective Sergeant George Moyer participated in the evaluation process for a newly proposed county-wide records management system. He was one of about 30 law enforcement professionals who were asked to provide their advice on the various proposals.
- On August 30<sup>th</sup>, Chief Kozeniewski was one of the guest speakers at the Living Branches (formerly the Souderton Mennonite Home.) He spoke about the various capabilities of the police department and how it provides services to the community. This was followed by a lively question and answer session. The Chief and the other area police chiefs will be frequent guests at the monthly series which is held in an informal setting.
