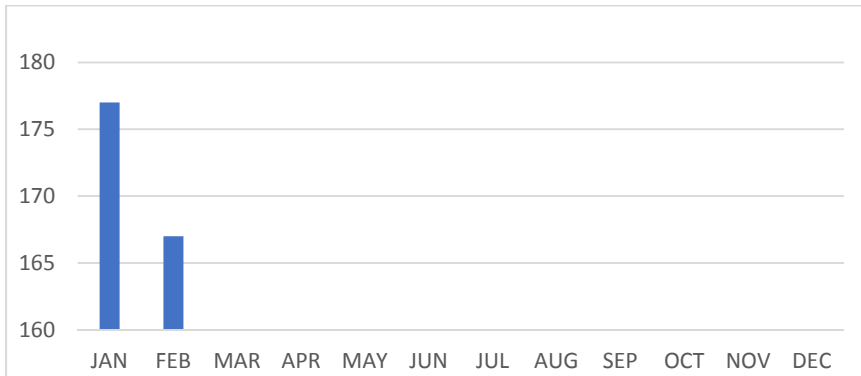



12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH

- On February 11th, the department took delivery of new portable and mobile radios as part of a multi-million dollar upgrade to the Montgomery County Emergency Dispatch System. The Motorola radios are supplied with the latest technology available.
- Chief Kozeniewski attended a seminar on March 16th regarding labor and disciplinary issues. It was presented by an attorney from Eckert, Seamans Law Offices.
- Our newest officer, Ryan Kochersperger, is progressing with his field training program. His mentors, Officers Tim Boyle and Glenn Kranich, monitor his performance in the line of duty. Additionally, they are providing him with advice and direction that is pertinent to the Franconia Township Police Department.
- On February 24th, the Chief attended the meeting of the Montgomery County Association of Township Officials. He was accompanied by township manager Jon Hammer and Planning & Zoning Coordinator Beth Gooch. The meeting was highlighted by a panel discussion of attorneys, officials and police chiefs regarding the impending implementation of the legal medical marijuana operation in the Commonwealth.
