## **POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH OF AUGUST 2019**

**Public Safety - Traffic Enforcement** – During the month of August, our patrol officers participated in the “Buckle up PA” safe driving/seat belt initiative, funded by a grant through the PA Department of Transportation. Officers patrolled on varying shifts which were dedicated solely to enforcement regarding aggressive driving and seat belt violations. Additionally Roving DUI patrols were conducted for the sole purpose of identifying and stopping drunk drivers.

**Community Engagement** – Throughout the month of August, Officers assisted neighborhoods and community groups with road closures and traffic safety for block parties and charitable events.

**August 5 - Community Relations** – Chief Martin attended the annual law enforcement- Souderton School District Principal’s roundtable discussion.

**August 22 – Community Response** – Patrol Officers posted “School’s Open” signs throughout the township as part of the Keystone AAA Annual Safety Campaign.

**August 26 – Community Engagement** – Chief Martin participated in a multi-jurisdictional Press Conference with the Ambler Branch NAACP for the purpose of announcing unification and the commencement of new initiatives to enhance racial and cultural relations throughout the region.
