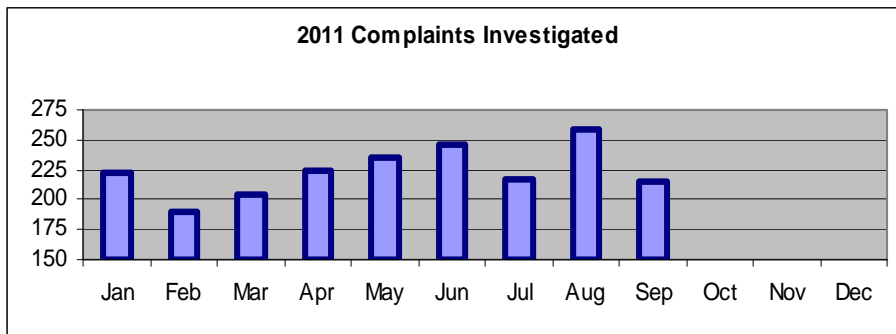
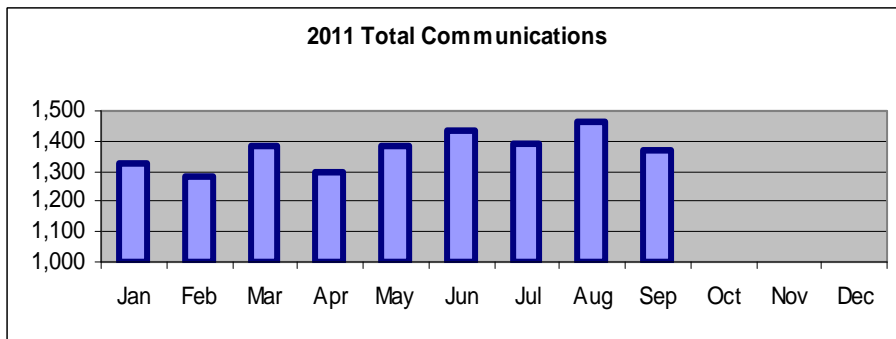



1. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH

- The Franconia Police Citizens Police Academy held its inaugural class on September 21st. Twenty-one township residents are attending the Academy which is being held on six consecutive Wednesday nights. Township police officers and guest speakers from other law enforcement disciplines are making presentations on various topics such as, the history of law enforcement, the judicial system, crimes code and vehicle laws, and crime scene investigations. Corporal Steve Rinker is the coordinator of this project for his Community Leadership Institute class.
- The police department assisted with traffic control for the Univest Grand Prix Bike Race on Saturday, September 17th. Officers maintained road closures on Leidy road, Cowpath Road, and West Broad Street for several hours throughout the day. The department expended 48 man hours for the detail.
- Officer Wayne Pursell attended four days of training with the Montgomery County Major Incident Response Team. He was trained in crowd control tactics, firearms tactics, and exposure to hazardous materials in riot situations. The county provided for his expenses through Homeland Security funding.
