

12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITES DURING THE MONTH

- During October, all members of the department participated in their second firearms qualification training for 2012. Officer Chris Hinnershitz coordinated the training which included qualifications with the patrol rifles, low-light shooting, and tactical techniques to be implemented during high-risk vehicle stops.
- On October 29th, the area was affected directly by Hurricane Sandy. There was a moderate amount of damage incurred by Franconia Township, which consisted of fallen trees and downed utility wires.
 - A substantial portion of the township was without electric power through Friday, November 2nd, with nearly all of it restored by November 6th.
 - The police department responded to approximately forty storm-related calls during that time period. Two homes were evacuated after trees had fallen on top of them, making them uninhabitable.
 - The only known injury was incurred by a woman who whose car struck a large tree that had just fallen in front of her on the 200 block of Cowpath Road.
 - The township Emergency Management Center was activated at 11:00 a.m. on October 29th at the police department headquarters. Township Emergency Management Director Ray Scheeler and Assistant Coordinator Al Gesullo managed operations during the height of the storm and were of great assistance to the police department.
 - The department expended about 100 man hours to handle storm related issues, such as blockading roads, assisting motorists, evacuating the persons from the damaged homes, and cleanup.
