



## 12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITES DURING THE MONTH

- The department hosted its second Special Needs Open House on Saturday, May 19th. There was a large turnout from families in the community who have members with special needs. Additionally, quite a few clients from the residential programs participated in the activities that were presented by the police, fire, and EMS communities.
- Several members of the department attended a training session that was sponsored by the Souderton Area School District on May 14th. Representatives from the Montgomery County District Attorney's Office provided instruction to police and the education staff regarding newly mandated reporting requirements on suspected child abuse cases.
- On May 27th, Det. Sgt. George Moyer and Officer David Klepfer received instruction from the school district on Student Threat Assessments.
- Members of the department participated in a DUI checkpoint on Harleysville Pike on Friday evening, May 30th. This is our annual checkpoint that is part of our participation in the North Penn DUI Task Force. Several drivers with elevated alcohol levels were removed from driving further and two persons were arrested for DUI violations.
- Officer Glenn Kranich was re-certified as our department's Taser instructor.
