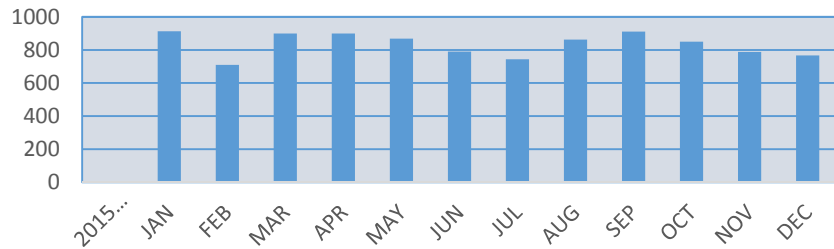

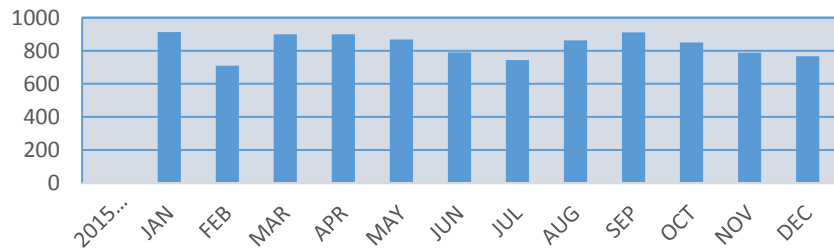



## 12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITES DURING THE MONTH

- On December 2<sup>nd</sup>, Chief Kozeniewski attended a training seminar that was presented by the FBI Philadelphia Office on active shooter incidents. Information was provided on current trends, profiles of shooters, and the use of social media in these incidents.
- The Chief also attended the annual Souderton-Telford Rotary Club's Christmas party for deserving children. The event was held at the Indian Valley Country Club on December 17<sup>th</sup>. The children are selected through the Indian Valley Boys and Girls Club.
- On December 22<sup>nd</sup>, Officer Travis Bivighouse arrested a Philadelphia man for the theft of nearly \$8,000 of diesel fuel from the Bergey's Fuel Center. The man had made several visits during the month to fill large tanks in the bed of his truck. All purchases were made with stolen or cloned credit cards. Officer Bivighouse alertly took the man into custody while he was still at the fuel center.
