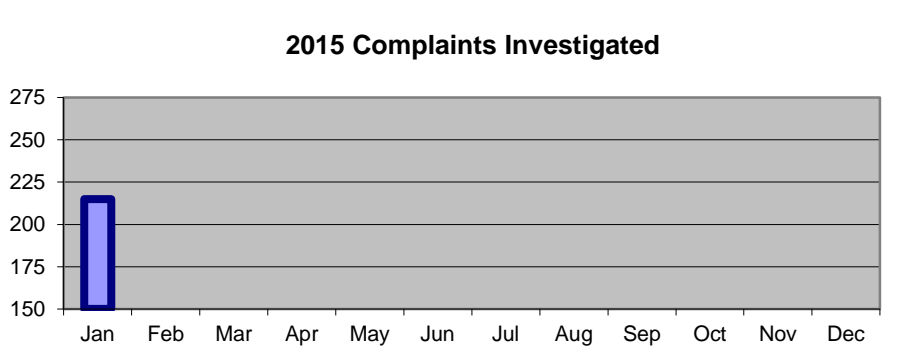
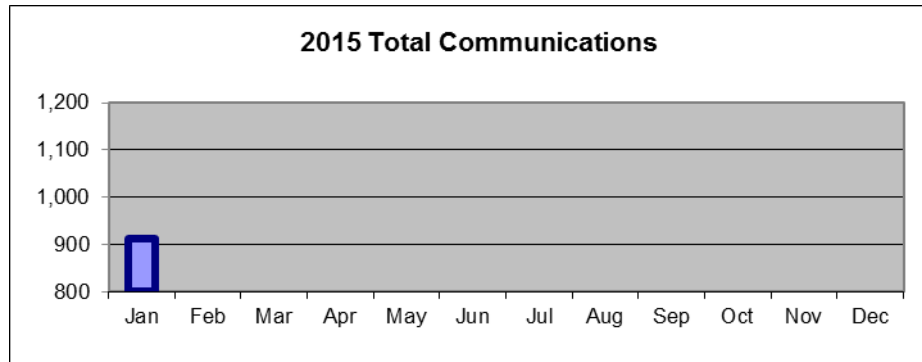



12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH

- The police department has been a participating member of the North Penn Tactical Response Team since 1988. The team is comprised of specially trained officers from each of the eleven police departments in the northwest region of Montgomery County. On January 1, 2015, the team merged with the Central Montgomery County team to form a new regional team known as Montgomery County SWAT – Central Region. The team provides services for situations that require expertise during high-risk operations such as, barricaded gunmen and arrests of wanted fugitives.
- Franconia Township was listed as the fifteenth safest community in Pennsylvania according to a recently released study by the real estate blog Movoto. The study used statistic from the 2013 FBI Uniform Crime Report.
- A township resident was arrested by the police department on January 8th for the burglary of a restaurant in the Indian Valley Shopping Center on December 21, 2014.
