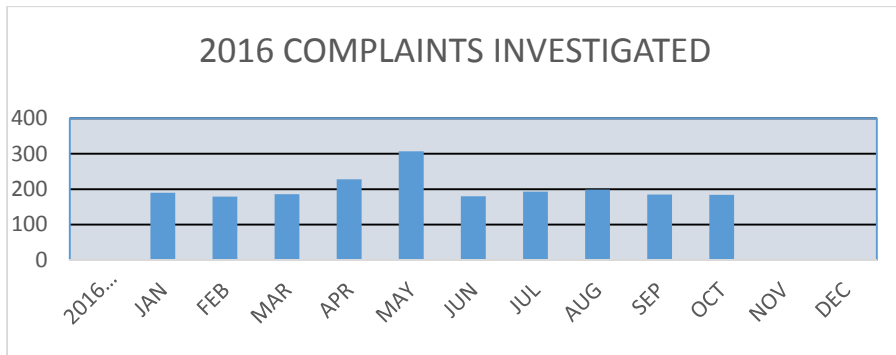
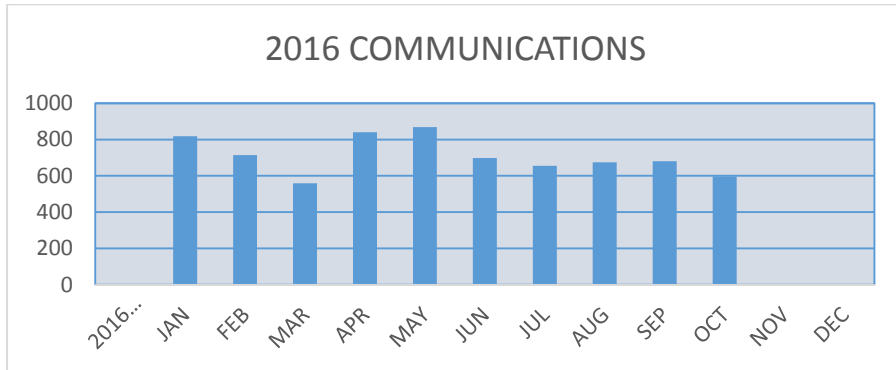



## 12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH

- On October 5, 2016, our officers participated in the annual Walk-to-School event at the West Broad Street Elementary School. Officers from Franconia and Souderton greeted numerous students and their families for the morning stroll down West Broad Street from Main Street to the school.
- Franconia officers, along with members of the Souderton and Telford Police Departments, maintained a high-visibility presence at the Indian Crest Junior High School throughout the day. This was in response to the social media events that indicated that “killer clowns” were targeting schools for violence. One post indicated that Indian Crest had been targeted. The officers maintained the assignment on October 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> until it was determined that the threat was a hoax.
- Chief Kozeniewski attended a labor seminar regarding police employment issues on October 13<sup>th</sup>. The training was sponsored by the Police Chiefs Association of Montgomery County.
- On October 26<sup>th</sup>, Detective Sergeant George Moyer conducted tours of the police facility for the students from the Indian Creek Day School on Harleysville Pike.
