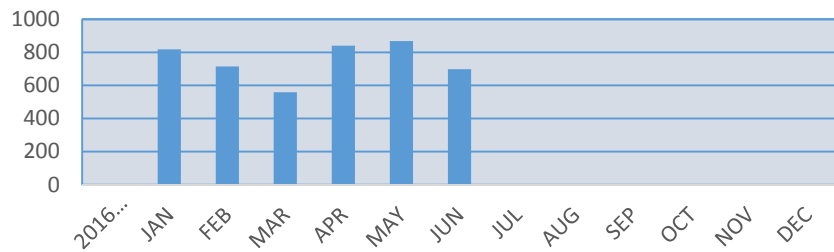

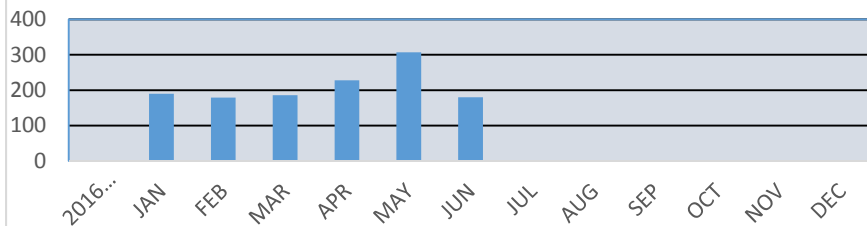



12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH

- Chief Kozeniewski & Det. Sgt. George Moyer attended a training session that was presented by the PA Chiefs of Police Association on June 1, 2016. The course was entitled "How to Leverage Accreditation to Defend Against Litigation."
- On June 13th, Corporal Ed Hall made a presentation to the Boy Scout Troop at Little Zion Church on the dangers of drug and alcohol abuse.
- A trial jury found Peter Atem guilty of Murder in the First Degree on June 17th. Atem was charged with the stabbing death of a fellow employee at the MOPAC Rendering Plant in February of 2015. The work of Det. Sgt. Moyer, Cpl. Hall, Officer Dave Klepfer, and Officer Travis Bivighouse was instrumental in the case preparation and bringing about the verdict.
- All department officers participated in their first firearms qualification course for the year. Our Lead Firearms Officer Bivighouse conducted the training. A second round of qualifications will be held in September.
