

12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITES DURING THE MONTH

- On February 11th, the department took delivery of new portable and mobile radios as part of a multi-million dollar upgrade to the Montgomery County Emergency Dispatch System. The Motorola radios are supplied with the latest technology available.
- Chief Kozeniewski attended a seminar on March 16th regarding labor and disciplinary issues. It was presented by an attorney from Eckert, Seamans Law Offices.

Additionally, they are providing him with advice and direction that is pertinent to the Franconia Township Police Department.

He was accompanied by township manager Jon Hammer and Planning & Zoning Coordinator Beth Gooch. The meeting was highlighted by a panel discussion of attorneys, officials and police chiefs regarding the impending implementation of the legal medical marijuana operation in the Commonwealth.
