

## 12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITES DURING THE MONTH

- Officer Tim Boyle successfully completed the Penn State Field Training Officers course in January. He is now one of the leaders who is assigned to train our newly hired officer as well as future hires. Officer Boyle will closely monitor the work habits of the new officers while serving as a teacher and mentor.
- On January 16, 2017, Ryan Kochersperger was hired as the department's new full-time officer. He had served as a part-time officer with the Telford Police Department during the past two years.
- The department took receipt of a supply of Naloxone (also known by its brand name Narcan from the Montgomery County Department of Public Safety. Our officers have been trained to administer the nasal spray to victims of overdoses from opioid medications. All police departments in the county now carry the Narcan. So far, more than 100 people have been revived by police officers throughout Montgomery County.
