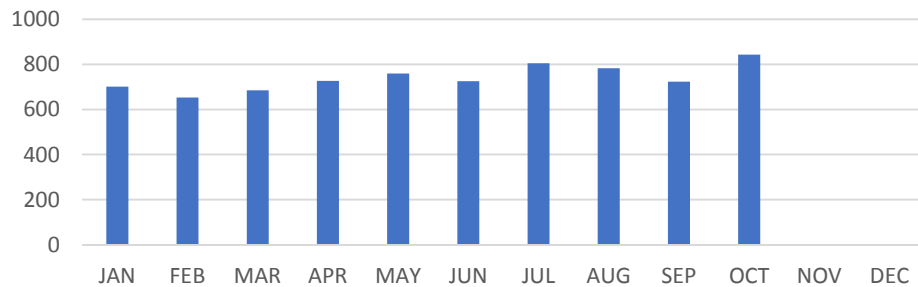

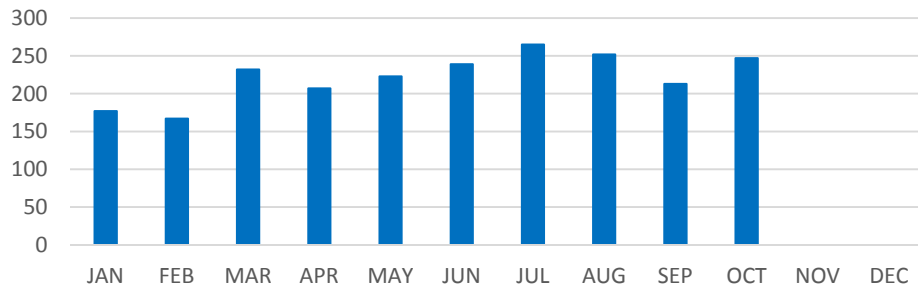



## 12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES DURING THE MONTH

- On October 3<sup>rd</sup> and October 4<sup>th</sup>, all active officers from the department successfully completed their second round of firearms qualifications for 2017. This session included rifle training, “shoot/don’t shoot” decision making, and tactical protection during shooting situations.
- Officer Tim Boyle assisted the students at West Broad Street Elementary School during their annual Walk-to-School day with their family members on October 4<sup>th</sup>.
- On the same day, both the police department and township administration buildings were evacuated when a well-meaning resident brought several pieces of what appeared to be explosive devices. He had found the items in his home and was looking for a means of disposal. The Montgomery County Sheriff’s Department Bomb Disposal Unit responded and determined that the items were inert and safe. The incident lasted for just over two hours.
- Chief Kozeniewski and Detective Sergeant George Moyer attended the International Association of Chiefs of Police Training Conference that was held in Philadelphia from October 22<sup>nd</sup> through October 24<sup>th</sup>.
- Det. Sgt. Moyer also conducted the semi-annual Drug Take Back Day at the Maplewood Estates on Saturday, October 28<sup>th</sup>. Residents deposited sixty-six pounds of unwanted or expired prescription medications for disposal.
