

12. POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITES DURING THE MONTH

 During January and February, Det. Sgt. George Moyer, Off. Eric Frary, and Off. Glenn Kranich worked actively on an investigation of a residence where both the township and the police department received numerous complaints. The complaints were regarding disturbance issues, continuous vehicle traffic, and utility issues.

Our officers held a meeting with neighbors to hear their complaints. They set up a plan of action and, over the course of several weeks, worked diligently with other law enforcement agencies. As a result, the team made several arrests at the home, while recovering stolen firearms and a cache of illegal controlled substances. The officers reconvened with the neighbors afterward. They were appreciative of the police efforts in this case.

- Officer Tim Boyle participated in a review of security issues with members of the Immanuel Leidy's Church. This meeting, held on February 3rd, was a preparedness discussion in light of recent shootings at places of worship around the country.
- On February 8th, Off. Glenn Kranich assisted Lansdale PD with crowd control at their train station for the afternoon return of fans from the Philadelphia Eagles victory parade. No problems were encountered. This was in response to a countywide Mutual Aid callout for all police departments.
- Later that evening, Det. Sgt. Moyer and police chiefs from neighboring jurisdictions participated in a town hall panel discussion on immigration issues. The event was sponsored by the ACLU and was held at the Maplewood Estates.

 On February 26th, Chief Kozeniewski and Sgt. Moyer met with neighboring chiefs at the Souderton Area School District offices to discuss our current response plans in the event of an armed intruder into one of the schools. Plans were made to update our response protocol as well as to provide more training for the officers and school staffs.
