POLICE DEPARTMENT ACTIVITES DURING THE MONTH OF MAY 2019

<u>May 6 - Community Relations</u> — Chief Martin presented information on Senior Driving Safety and Fraud/Scam Prevention to the Veteran's Group at the Peter Becker Community. Approximately 50 residents attended the presentation which included a question & answer session.

May 8 & 9 - Accreditation – The police department has been recommended for recertification of accreditation by the Pennsylvania Police Chief's Association as part of the Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Accreditation Program. Three trained assessors from various counties within Pennsylvania performed an on-site review of our personnel, equipment, policies, procedures and facilities. The assessors found that our police department complies all 133 standards, therefore we will be endorsed for another three-year term of accreditation. The Franconia Township Police Department was first accredited in 2010 and remains one of only 116 police department out of more than 300 agencies which have enrolled since 2001.

May 16 - Training - Sgt. Moyer, Officers Frary, Kranich and Kochersperger attended Annual Drug Task Force Training which was conducted by the Montgomery County District Attorney's Oπice. During the training, Officer Ryan Kochersperger was duly sworn as a Special County Detective, thus enabling him to join the other team members in multijurisdictional investigations.

<u>May 22— Community Relations</u> — Chief Martin, Sgt. Moyer, and Officers Boyle & Kochersperger attended a graduation dinner for the members of the 2019 Franconia Township Citizens Police Academy. The graduates were formally recognized for their achievement at the April 2019 Township Board of Supervisor's Meeting.

<u>May 23 – Community Relations</u> – The Franconia Police Benevolent Association donated \$5,000 to Souderton Area School District autism programs. Money was raised through the sale of specially designed autism awareness patches; patches are still available. The presentation was made at the May 23 Souderton Area School Board meeting.
