




# Complaints 5 Year Comparison






#### **Vehicle Crashes Comparisons by Month**




### **Vehicle Crash Injuries & Fatalities 5 Year Comparison**

#### North Penn Area Driving Under The Influence Task Force

2011 Activity Report

The Franconia Township Police Department has been a member of the North Penn DUI Task Force since the inception of the unit. The team is made up of officers from the surrounding municipalities, and is directed by Officer Thomas Starner from the Hatfield Township Police Department. The team is funded by grant monies from the PA DUI Association. For the fiscal year of 2011 there was \$70,000.00 allocated to the team. The primary factor of the program is to present awareness and the dangers of DUI. The goal is to reduce the numbers of suspected impaired drivers on the highways in our area and across the state.

Officers from Franconia Township Police take part in the program conducting roving patrols, and standard checkpoint details. The following information is a break down of the details which our department assisted with, the number of hours spent and what type details were conducted here in our township:

#### Roving Patrols:

- Two details were conducted, each for a minimum time of four hours, during the late evening hours.
  - Driver Contacts 30
  - DUI Arrests 1
  - Traffic citations 5
  - Warning notices 25

#### Standard Checkpoints:

- On July 10, 2011 the officers from Franconia Township and other members from the North Penn DUI team conducted a standard checkpoint on Harleysville Pike near the Williams, Bergey and Koffel Funeral Home in the township.
  - Driver Contacts 400+
  - DUI Arrests 9
  - Signs of impairment but not arrested 5 (These drivers were tested and had alcohol levels that were below .08%.)

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Franconia Township Highway Safety Unit (HSU) was created in 2006. The officers who make up this unit specialize in the areas of traffic enforcement, motor carrier safety, and accident investigation/reconstruction. Along with the other members of the police department, the officers on the HSU strive to ensure safety on the township's roadways. For 2011, the Franconia Township Police Department had over 4,900 traffic-related public contacts. This is an increase of **67%** compared to last year's traffic-related contacts.

#### **STATISTICS**

#### **ENFORCEMENT**

- **1,650** Traffic Citations were issued.
- 169 Faulty Equipment Notices / Written Warnings were issued.
- **1,540** Verbal or Written Warnings were issued.

#### **OTHER STATISTICS**

- Officers assisted 124 disabled motorists over the course of the year.
- The JAMAR® traffic counter was used **2** times during the year.
- Officers removed 35 hazardous road obstructions from the roadways.
- The speed display unit was utilized at **22** different locations in 2011.
- Officers conducted 1,414 traffic enforcement details throughout the township.
- 13 Roving DUI Details were conducted.
- Officers assisted 66 motorists with vehicle lock-outs.
- Traffic control was conducted **207** times in the township. This includes accident scenes, funerals, and special events/details.

#### ACCIDENT INVESTIGATIONS

Officers responded to a total of 246 traffic accidents in 2011. Of those accidents:

• 117 were classified as **REPORTABLE** where at least one vehicle had to be towed and/or injuries were reported.

In 2011,**57** people were injured as a result of motor vehicle accidents in Franconia Township.

The specially trained officers of the HSU investigated 1 fatal motor vehicle accident.

129 were classified as NON-REPORTABLE where no injuries were reported and no towing of vehicles
was involved.

# MOTOR CARRIER SAFETY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (MCSAP)

• In 2009, the Franconia Township Police Department became a member of the Montgomery-Bucks Motor Carrier Enforcement Team (MCET). This unit operates in both counties and is made up of specially trained officers from Hatfield Township, Montgomery Township, Cheltenham Township, Abington Township, Horsham Township, Warrington Township, Whitemarsh Township, the PA Department of Revenue, and the United States Drug Enforcement Agency. Occasionally, officers from other jurisdictions also assist on truck details.



- For 2011, the township's motor carrier officers conducted the following in Franconia:
- ~80 Level 1 Inspections.
- ~350 Violations were discovered.
- 32 Vehicles were placed Out-Of-Service for major safety violations.
- 7 Drivers were placed out of service due to major violations.
- o 3 Trucks were weighed.

- Several officers received their update training in Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST).
- Officer Kurt DeForrest and Officer Pete Sandor received their SFST certification.
- Officer Pete Sandor and Officer Al Gesullo attended a class on High-Risk Vehicle Stops.
- Officer Travis Bivighouse attended a course on Tire Forensics.
- Corporal Stephen Rinker attended MCSAP updates as required by the Commercial Vehicle Safety Section (CVSS) of the Pennsylvania State Police.

#### **OTHER HSU NEWS FOR 2011...**

In response to several speeding complaints from residents in the area of the 600 and 700 Blocks of Morwood Road, Officer Pete Sandor and Officer Travis Bivighouse erected high-visibility TARGETED SPEED ENFORCEMENT ZONE signs. The posting of these signs, followed by aggressive speeding enforcement details, have had a major impact on the speeding problem on Morwood Road. Officers continue to monitor and enforce speeding in this area, along with the other locations that receive regular speeding enforcement.

This new project proved so successful, that this strategy may be implemented in other sections of the township in 2012.

#### HIGHLIGHTS OF DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES FOR 2011

#### <u>Personnel</u>

- The department welcomed two new part-time officers in May. Officers Shawn Stiver and Brian Kelly successfully completed their Field Training Program and are now working on scheduled shifts.
- Officer Albert Gesullo retired on December 31<sup>st</sup> after thirty years of service to the township. He was honored for his accomplishments by his peers, family, and friends at a dinner in November.

#### **Enforcement Activities**

- Four teens were charged with hate crimes after they spray painted ethnic slurs on the car and home of a township resident.
- Franconia Township Police hosted a DUI Checkpoint on Harleysville Pike on June 10<sup>th</sup>. Eight persons were charged with Driving Under the Influence.
- On July 4<sup>th</sup>, officers from the department responded to a home in the township where a wanted man had barricaded himself with his female friend. After several hours of attempts to have the man come out of the house, members of the North Penn Tactical Response Team entered the home to remove an elderly woman and an infant from danger. Shortly thereafter, the man, who had fled to the basement, surrendered peacefully.
- Officers from the department provided traffic control at numerous intersections in the township on Saturday, September 17<sup>th</sup> for the annual Univest Grand Prix cycle race.
- On October 5<sup>th</sup>, department officers, as well as those from Souderton and the Montgomery County Detective Bureau, served a high risk search warrant on a township home. A resident of the home had been operating a heroin dealing operation from the home. He was taken into custody at that time.

#### School Resource Officer/Drug Abuse Resistance Education

- School Resource Officer David Klepfer continued to be a presence on a regular basis at the Indian Crest Junior High School and the Souderton Area High School. He was able to intervene when problems with students arose as well as being an invaluable resource for personnel at the schools.
- Unfortunately, the SRO program has been reduced in its responsibilities as budgetary issues have caused a reduction in funding for the program. Officer Klepfer will continue to be a presence in the schools but his focus will now be on handling everyday patrol duties.
- Officer Klepfer also conducted the Drug Abuse Resistance Education classes at Vernfield Elementary, Franconia Elementary, and West Broad Street Elementary Schools. Over 200 fourth grade students received drug and alcohol use prevention training during a ten-week curriculum.

#### National Night Out Against Crime

 The department hosted its fifteenth annual National Night Out celebration on August 2<sup>nd</sup>. The event was very well attended as new attractions were included this year. Our coordinator, Janice Froshour, did an outstanding job in organizing the activities. With the help of staff, volunteers, and local organizations, the evening a great success.

#### Community Activities

- Corporal Steve Rinker completed his participation in the Community Leadership Institute that is sponsored by the Indian Valley Chamber of Commerce. He is the third member of the police department to attend the CLI.
- The CLI class chose to create the Citizen's Police Academy as their class project. Cpl. Rinker and his classmates presented a six-week program to interested members of the community on topics such as: criminal and vehicle laws, criminal investigations, and vehicle accident reconstruction.
- Another activity that is an outgrowth of the National Night Out is the annual Food Drive. Several businesses in the township acted as drop-off points for food donations during the month of July. The over 700 pounds of food collected was then transported to two local food banks by several members of the department.
- Fifteen children from the Ukraine were hosted to a cook-out and tour of the police department on July 29<sup>th</sup>. The children were in the country for four weeks to view American life.

#### **Training**

- All sworn members of the department completed their annual in-service update classes during the year. The sixteen hours of instruction focuses on new laws, current court rulings, and officer safety tactics. The training is mandated by the Municipal Police Officers Education and Training Commission.
- Detective George Moyer attended the annual conference of the Pennsylvania Juvenile Officers Association. He is a member of their executive board.
- All of the department's officers had their transition training for the Glock handguns. All officers qualified at the range with their weapons.
- Officers Tim Boyle and Wayne Pursell attended training for the Montgomery County Major Incident Response Team.
- Officers Glenn Kranich and Chris Hinnershitz continued with their regular training as members of the North Penn Tactical Response Team.
- Officers Kurt DeForrest and Glenn Kranich attended the Fundamentals of Supervision training course that was presented by the Police Chiefs Association of Montgomery County.

#### Commendations
